### Courses recently accredited under DIT are as follows:

*Expanding Our Culture Beyond Safety* - Designed to help continuously improve an organisation's safety performance by addressing the factors critical to building an incident-free culture, where individuals take personal responsibility for their safety and the safety of those around them.

*Basic Drilling and Offshore Operations Overview* – Provides participants with an understanding of procedures used to drill a well and problems that can be encountered. This is an excellent program for new employees, office personnel or anyone who is associated with drilling but might not be involved with day-to-day operations.

*Stuck Pipe Prevention* – Designed to prevent the most costly of drilling-related problems, stuck pipe, and the mechanics of what causes sticking. Preventive measures are explored to avoid getting stuck, including warning signs of an impending problem and ways to break the chain of events leading to stuck pipe. In the event of a problem occurring, initial steps are outlined to minimise the event and free the pipe quickly.

*Assessor Training* – Teaches the fundamental assessment skills needed for individuals to competently fulfil the assessment functions required in the administration of a competence assurance program.

## CEOC International Teams Up With EFAC: Together Minimising Risks and Maximising Safety in Europe and Beyond

**Paris/Brussels, November 2010** - CEOC International, the International Confederation of Inspection and Certification Organisations, and EFAC, the European Federation of Associations of Certification Bodies, have sealed further close cooperation.

The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed by the CEOC President, Dr Hugo Eberhardt (TUV AUSTRIA) and EFAC Chairman, Ivan Savov (Moody International) after the ISO CASCO Plenary Meeting on 18 and 19 November in Paris.

The signing of the present MoU follows a series of strategic moves toward closer cooperation in the Testing, Inspection, Certification and Accreditation (TICA) sector.

Earlier in 2010 CEOC International reinforced its cooperation with two other major players in the sector, namely EUROLAB (European Federation of National Associations of Measurement, Testing and Analytical Laboratories) and EFNDT (European Federation for Non-Destructive Testing).

Concrete results of the cooperations are, for instance, the joint management of the JTCPTC (Joint EUROLAB-CEOC Technical Committee on Product Testing and Certification) and the newly created joint CEOC-EFNDT committee on non-destructive testing issues.

These agreements illustrate an important step in the further development of the European inspection, testing and certification sector and enhance the political visibility and technical influence toward the European institutions and organisations in Brussels. Moreover, they reflect the global call for a concerted action with view to the growing number of unsafe products reaching the European markets and the ongoing ageing of technical and industrial installations.

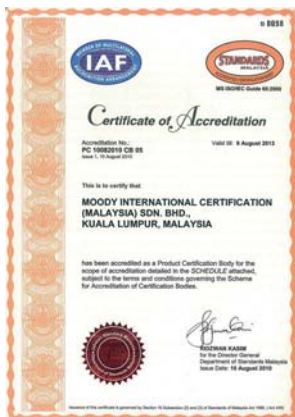
## Pro-Inspect, Inc. Receives 2010 Safety Excellence Award

## SAFETY ZONE – Office Safety

You may think that since you work in an office you don't have to worry about being injured. However, offices can become dangerous because people don't anticipate the potential hazards.

Studies show that over one-fourth of office injuries are caused by falls. One-third of the falls incurred by women are due to wearing high heels, which make falls more likely. Consider wearing lower, wider heels. Other things that can cause falls are spills on floors, torn carpets or exposed carpet seams, electrical cords running across the floor, open desk or file drawers, boxes or supplies

stored in aisles, or waste baskets placed where you could trip over them. Look around to see if you can spot any of these potential problems. If you find any, take the time to get them fixed.

If your office has stairs or steps, watch out! Falls on stairs cause more than 33,000 disabling work injuries each year. About 2/3 of the workers falling on stairs were not using handrails when they fell. Many were carrying objects, or slipped on something left on the steps. Accidents on stairs are usually serious - 80% of these falls result in lost work days. Use handrails, pick up anything you see on the stairs, don't use stairs for storage, and don't try to carry things when using stairs if you can avoid it.

Watch out for avalanches if you pile "stuff" on top of filing cabinets. Even a carefully stacked pile may start sliding due to vibration from opening and shutting file drawers. Also keep an eye out for overloaded upper file drawers. This may cause the entire filing cabinet to tip over on top of you when you open the drawer. Re-distribute some of the weight to the lower drawers to reduce this chance, and check to make sure the filing cabinet is bolted to the adjacent cabinet, if it can be done.



These are just a few tips that can make your office area safer. Look around, and you no doubt will spot other problems that can be easily fixed. When you see a hazard, don't assume it is someone else's responsibility. If you don't do something about it, who will?

Moody International has been an integral part of the Canadian oil and gas community for 50 years.

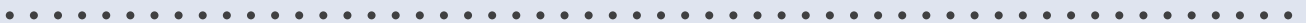

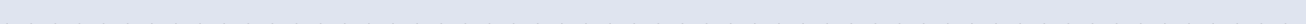
### Moody Brazil 25 Years
